A	cynical			(Adj) believing that people only do things to serve their own needs; believing that all people are motivated by selfishness; unwilling to believe that people have honest, good, or sincere reasons for doing something					
B	Intolerant			(adj) a. Someone who is unwilling to accept differences in opinions, other ideas, beliefs, religions, etc.; not able to accept ways of thinking & behaving that are different from your own; bigoted; close-minded b) not able to take particular medicines or eat particular food without suffering bad effects; unable to digest or metabolize a food, drug, etc.					
C	Deny			(verb) a) to refuse to admit something, agree to something, or acknowledge something; to say something isn't true or that you do not believe in something b) to refuse to allow someone to have or do something					
D	Indignation			(noun) Anger about something thought of as unfair, mean, or unjust; anger or scorn that is a reaction to injustice, ingratitude, or meanness; righteous anger; feelings of anger and surprise because you feel insulted or unfairly treated.					
E	objective			(adj) Someone or something without bias or prejudice; based on facts, or making a decision that is based on facts rather than on your feelings or beliefs. (noun): a goal or something to aim for; something you are trying to achieve.					
F	subjective			(adj) something that is based on personal opinion; a statement, report, attitude, etc. that is influenced by personal opinion and can therefore be unfair.

G	Anecdote	(noun): a short entertaining story based on a personal experience; a brief, often funny, story of something that happened.
H	Assert	(verb): a) To state firmly that something is true; to make a statement with full confidence of its truth and factuality b) To make a claim or defense c) To make your beliefs or desires known in a strong and forceful way
I	genre	(noun): a category of art, music, or literature
J	context	(noun) a. The words that surround other words & impact their meaning; the words that come just before a word or sentence and that help you understand its meaning b. the setting in which something occurs; the whole situation, background, or environment that determine, specify, or a clarify particular event.
